<p>European Fund Scholarship</p>	<p>The European Fund Scholarship Program was established to recognize the academic accomplishments of Students graduating from High School who are members of the EF or a dependant of a member of the European Fund. Overall the European Fund Scholarship Program recognizes and rewards exceptional academic achievement at the High School level and encourages students to continue Post Secondary studies. See note concerning CEGEP.</p>
<p>VALUE</p>	<p>The EF annually allocates a sum of euros in support of the European Fund Scholarship Program. The Scholarships are based on academic performance and are awarded based on the student achieving the Honours Role Standard at the High School they are graduating from. Since the potential number of students eligible will vary from year to year the number of awards will vary from year to year. For example, if an allocation of 12K euros is made and 10 students qualified for the award than each student would receive 1,200 euros. (12,000 divided by 10 awards equals 1,200 euros). However, the maximum amount given per student is 2,000 euros. For example, if 5 students qualified for the award each would be given 2,000 euros. Overall, the nominal value of the award is based on the number of applicants to a maximum of 2,000 euros per student.</p>
<p>ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Be a member or a dependant of a member of the European Fund as per the definition in the EF Constitution. • Be in full time attendance and in their final graduation year of High School. • Have been accepted to full-time attendance for studies at a Post Secondary level the September following graduation from High School. This includes 1st year attendance at a CEGEP in Quebec, or first year attendance at a post-secondary vocational training institution. • Applicants must provide proof of acceptance to a post-secondary education institution. • The applicant must achieve the Honours Role Standard for the high school they are attending. • Provide proof of academic performance.
<p>SELECTION PROCEDURES</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Students must have submitted all of the required documentation to the Corporate Services Officer CFSU (E) with the applicable signatures by the published deadline. • The principal of the school must sign the application stating that the applicant has met the Honours Role Standard. • Selection is based upon academic achievement during the graduating year of secondary study (an official transcript must be submitted by 30 July).

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Write a 500-word essay on a topic determined by the NMR. (Submitted by 31 April)
